Birthed in the South Bronx, there has been a struggle with educational budget cuts; toxic wastelands pollution; medical concerns due to a lack of resources and health care; diseases like HIV-AIDS and Sexually Transmitted Diseases. **Momma's Hip Hop Kitchen** seeks to create awareness for healthy alternatives for women and their families.

Momma's Hip Hop Kitchen, Volume: 5, "Be the Cure!" will be honoring International Women's Month by addressing some of the health disparities that affect women, specifically women of color. The goal this year is to use the artistry of hip-hop to initiate dialogue and bring awareness to both reproductive cancers (i.e. cervical, endometrial, ovarian, vaginal) and breast cancer, which disproportionately affect communities of color.
